School Improvement Plan

A copy of the Standards and Quality report which evaluates the work of the school last session and a summary of the improvement plan which outlines our priorities for the coming session, are included with this newsletter for your information.

You will see that one of our aims is to improve Health and Wellbeing outcomes - particularly PE - for our pupils. To this end, it would be very much appreciated if you could ensure you child always has suitable gym kit in school and also be aware that when appropriate, we will go outdoors for gym.

It is also our aim to improve the way in which progress is reported to you and develop advice to help you support your child's learning. I shall be looking to enlist the help of parents to do this and hope that as many of you who are able will feed into the process. More details will follow later

Pupil Voice

Again this year we are building upon opportunities for pupil responsibility and leadership in and around the school. Starting next week our P7 pupils will begin a 6 week training course to become Young Leaders which will equip them with skills in organisation, planning, communication and self evaluation. Senior pupils in P6 and P7 also have the opportunity to apply to become Prefects. Job descriptions and application forms are available from their teacher. Pupils from P1 - P7 will also have the opportunity to elect House Captains and representatives for our Eco and Pupil Councils.

Extra-Curricular Clubs

We have undertaken a consultation exercise with pupils to find out what sorts of clubs they would like to see in school. As you can imagine, the responses were varied and interesting!

Although we will not be able to meet all these

requests, the staff are keen to continue the good work established last session. It is hoped we can offer a variety of after school and lunchtime activities such as choir, art, dance, netball and a loom bands group at various times throughout the year. Individual teachers will send out permission slips at the appropriate time which children must return for clubs which are out with school hours. Jo Whaite - our Active Schools Coordinator is also arranging some sports clubs and taster sessions for pupils
