In Summary

- * Homework grids will be issued approximately every 4 weeks but will have the timescales clearly shown on it.
- Tasks in bold print are to be considered compulsory
- A minimum of at least 3 other tasks should be selected
- Parents are asked to support their child to plan and carry out tasks to the highest possible standard
- Parents should sign the grid to show which tasks have been completed
- Completed pieces can be returned to school at anytime up the final date

Did you know...?

- ♦ Children spend only 15% of their time in school
- Doing homework regularly throughout their school years equates to approximately an extra year's schooling
- When parents are involved, children do better and achieve more!

Learning at Home—why is it important?

We at Mattocks Primary School acknowledge the vital role that parents and carers play in their child's education. As a school community we are confident that the strength of the partnership between home and school will enhance the achievements of our pupils and promote an effective and positive ethos.

Home learning encompasses a wide variety of

opportunities whereby children's learning

can be shared and extended. It is a two way process between home and school and for this to be effective it is vital that we maintain good communication links. We achieve this by:

- Sharing children's learning in a termly learning journal

What will the revised homework entail?

Every month your child will be issued with a homework grid which will contain a variety of activities and tasks to be undertaken. These will cover a range of curricular areas and reflect the needs and interests of the children.

Some of the tasks will be in **bold text**, these are the ones that are considered to be **compulsory**.

The remaining tasks are at the parent's discretion as we recognise that there are varying demands on family time. However, we would expect that pupils would complete at least another 3 tasks from the grid of their own choice.

By working in this way, children will learn the importance of time management and organizational skills. We hope this will be a more meaningful and interesting way of extending the learning done in school to the home environment and wider world.

Pupils in the early stages of their reading and writing development will still require regular practice and reinforcement of these skills at home. Due to the frequency and immediacy required for these tasks, this will not form part of the homework grid but be recorded in the home / school digries.

Completed items can be returned to school at anytime within the allotted timescale but certainly by the due date.

It would be helpful if the grid could be signed / initialed by parents by each completed task

Pupils will receive feedback in the form of self and peer evaluation and teacher comments. We would also encourage parents to add their comments either on the grid or in homework digries.

In term 4 we will ask for feedback to help us evaluate this new policy. If however, there are any concerns in the meantime please contact the school.
